

Taupo Weekend. Saturday August 22 and Sunday 23 August.

This event is divided into three parts. Part one is a track day at Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park on Saturday. Part two is a visit to the car collection of Barry Hoffman at 2.45pm on Saturday. Part three on Sunday is morning tea at the Kinloch beach home of President Dennis and June Catchpole. This is followed by an interesting drive from Kinloch to Rotorua only using about 3 kilometres of Main Highways. A lovely country drive on roads (all sealed) that would not normally be used by motorists travelling from Kinloch to Rotorua. The event is completed in Rotorua at around 1pm and participants can choose to have lunch in Rotorua at their own convenience or drive home.

Those that wish to participate in the track day experience need to be on site at the Motor Race Track at 8am for registration and briefing at 9am. Please register your interest in the Track Day with John Bourke prior to 13th August as the Alfa Romeo Club has only allocated 10 places for our club. Cost per driver is \$140. A fun, non-competitive day with driver training available from track experienced male and female drivers. Entrants need to check with their Insurance Company regarding insurance, but please state to your insurance company that this event is non-competitive and not timed and meets all the safety requirements of Motorsport NZ. Raewyn will also book accommodation if you need it on the Friday night. There is also a free lunchtime drive around the track behind a pace car.

At 2.45pm on Saturday, we meet Barry Hoffman to view his car collection. Assembly point will be outside the Taupo Vintage Car Club, AC Baths Avenue, Taupo. Take Spa Road which is off the main street in Taupo and Spa Road leads to Centennial Drive and Hickling Park.

On Sunday we leave for Kinloch at 9am. After our normal club chatter and Coffee and Cakes (provided) by hosts Dennis and June, we leave at around 11am for the drive to Rotorua. Full map type instructions will be provided.
